

The Secret Sign of God אה Aleph/Tav

Most likely, you have probably never heard of the great Rabbi Akiva (50- 135 AD) a founder of Rabbinic Judaism. He established a great learning center in Jaffa, Israel where thousands of students/disciples studied. Rabbi Akiva later became one of the Rabbis martyred by the Romans for the Bar Kochba revolt in 135 AD. He had a profound belief that the first and last letters of the Hebrew Alphabet, אה , pronounced Aleph/Tav, was the Secret Sign of the God of Israel.

In the English translations, such as the very popular NIV Bible, Genesis 1:1 says, "In the beginning God created the Heavens and the Earth." Seems fine, right? But the very first sentence of Genesis states in Hebrew: "In the beginning, Elohim/God created אה the Heavens and אה the Earth." It reads from right to left Aleph/Tav are the 1st and 22nd letters of the Hebrew alphabet. Actually, we get the word alphabet from their 1st and 2nd letters pronounced Aleph-bet.

Let's break down the first sentence of the Hebrew Bible. There were no spaces, vowels or punctuation in the original manuscripts, they were added much later. Unless you have a Hebrew Bible the Aleph/Tav will not be included in your Bibles. (That's right you should feel ripped off as I do because 99.9% of translations don't have the Aleph/Tav and I have 30 different copies.)

אה Aleph/Tav is listed 606 times in the Hebrew Bible/Old Testament; what the Jews call the Torah. When it states God created the אה , the Hebrew Alphabet to create the universe through divine words. That's right, He created a divine language first to complete the rest of Creation.

Let's now go to the Gospel of Yochanan/John 1:1. Remember, it's highly likely that the Gospels were originally communicated through Hebrew/Aramaic and translated into Greek for the Gentiles.

This is what John should look like with the Aleph/Tav symbol inserted; 1:1-2 "In the beginning was the Word אה (Rhema the Greek for spoken/living word) and the Word was with אה God (Theos/Elohim), and the Word אה (Rhema) was God. The same was in the beginning with אה God." I am sure you are starting to see a pattern here.

Let's now go to Revelation 1:8 where Yeshua/Jesus is recorded by John the Apostle; "I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, saith the Lord, which is, and which was, and which is to come, the Almighty. NKJV

Let's restore this to its intended text; "I AM the Aleph and the Tav אה the beginning and the end says YHWH Elohim, which is, and which was and which is to come Elohim Tseva`ot, the (God of Hosts)!

This revelation would have rocked Rabbi Akiva's world and any other Rabbi worth his salt. If you put up a billboard in Jerusalem that said Yeshua/Jesus is the אה Aleph/Tav you could start a riot!

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
